1. **28-Day Rule**: You can legally live on your land in a mobile home or caravan for up to 28 days each year without needing planning permission.

2. **4-Year Rule**: If you live on your

land in a mobile home or caravan

- without being challenged for four years, you can often gain lawful use rights to remain there permanently.

 3. **While Building**: Once planning permission is granted to build a
- permanent structure, you're allowed to live in a caravan or mobile home on-site while construction is underway. For some people this could be for 30 years or more.
- 4. **Agricultural Use**: Land used for genuine agricultural purposes may allow temporary accommodation without planning permission, especially for seasonal workers or farmers.

 5. **Permitted Development**: You can erect certain small structures (like sheds or solar installations) on your land without planning permission under

permitted development rights.
